Passage looked to take advantage of this and for the last 7 mins of the game they piled on the pressure and Carrig defence was getting anxious so close to the end. After their nearest rivals were unable to match this result, Carrigtwohill were crowned champions in stylist fashion. Ten victories in a 14 match season and no defeats is a superb record at any level and sets them up to look forward to Division 2 soccer next season.
